The Village Network recognizes the importance in maintaining family connections, particularly while a youth is in treatment. Now available on our Wooster campus, we have the ability to offer **video conferencing**, as needed, for family visitations and/or team meetings.

Admission Criteria

- Male Youth
- Primary Ages 12 to 18-years-old

Treatment Services

- Full-day, on-grounds school staffed by Wooster City Schools
- 24/7 year-round, staff-secured cottage facilities
- Comprehensive diagnostic assessment
- Substance abuse assessment, education, & treatment
- 15 hours weekly of planned therapeutic group services
- Individual, family, recreational & expressive arts therapy
- Life skills training
- Risk assessment & safety planning
- Psychological and/or psychiatric evaluations
- Psychotropic medication management
- Aftercare and community follow-up
