Knox County/Mt. Vernon

The Transitional Living Program is only available at the Knox County/ Mt. Vernon location and is open to both male and females. It is a safe, secure living arrangement where older youth (16 to 21 years-old) prepare to live independently as adults while under program supervision.

The program teaches tangible skills and real-life application of the skills and can serve as a step-down from residential, treatment foster care, or an alternative safe environment.
